1. COURSE DESCRIPTION

1.1. Course objectives

The aim is to familiarize students with various forms of providing psychiatric care, to assist in the various organizational forms as efficient as possible and to establish good communication at all levels in the community. This could provide a work perception of clients and their involvement in biopsychosocial rehabilitation programs, enabling the prevention of serious consequences of the client, his family and the community.

The aim is to acquaint students with various modes of organization Mental Health Care from classic, hospital-oriented to the organization of psychiatry within the principles Community Case management. It is necessary to learn the models that have been established in European countries and observe the effectiveness of these models.

The planned outcome of course is to acquire knowledge and skills that can be efficient within the field of Mental Health Care for mentally disturbed patients with the application biopsychosocial model in practice. For this kind of work it is important to understand the functioning of all members of various teams who treat and care for patients, and the reaction of social environment in which it occurs. Expected to understand how the provision of care mentally ill person involved a large number of members whose task is to help sick members and that they support his family.
